Internal Quality Assurance Cell has taken intense steps to organize programmes on quality related themes to enhance institutional quality. It includes Orientation Programme for the First year Students, Orientation Programme for New Faculty members, Faculty Development Programme and International Conference.

Through IQAC, a programme has been arranged by ICT academy on the topic of "Communicative Impact with Voice Process" organized by the AtoS Praya's Foundation as a CSR initiative, amounted to .Rs. 50,000 . Nearly 50 students received both technical and soft skill training in the campus from 5.01.2023 to 30.01.2023

IQAC provides a number of programs with support from EDC, including the design thinking program, Vanniga Sutchamam, the EDII-TN sponsored workshop on entrepreneurship development, to celebrate Mahatma Gandhi National Entrepreneurship Month students set up a one day stall. They also held a workshop on making soap at home to help them develop their skills and get ready to start their own businesses in the future.

To continue the innovative journey, our college established an Innovative Incubation unit, which was officially inaugurated by Dr. K. Sivan, the former chairman of ISRO, and Director of Vikram Sarabai, Space Centre & the distinguished professor of ISRO.

enhance their calibre to tackle situations.

15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

N.M.S.Sermathai Vasan College for women shall focus on a holistic and overall personality development of students in tune with the major objectives of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 to make education more experiential, holistic, integrated, learnercentered, and flexible along with providing multiple entry and exit opportunities and evolve interdisciplinary thinking through enormous efforts. Since our institution, being an affiliated college comes under Madurai Kamaraj University, offers 12 UG and 6 PG courses spanning across science and arts stream aims at imparting an education that shall develop the intellectual, aesthetic, social, emotional and moral values in students. Our college B.Sc (Physics) department has introduced the certificate course "Introduction to Practical STEM Education" with the vision to introduce the basic concepts of Science and technology for the humanity students to come up with new ideas and innovation and to expand the learning opportunities in an interdisciplinary and applied approach. To offer flexible and innovative curriculum for the attainment of holistic and multidisciplinary education our college has an active Women Study centre and Yoga club which have the practise of celebrating International Women's Day and International Yoga Day along with providing short term

certificate course for all stream of students. To impart the students in the areas of community engagement and service, our college faculty and students engaged themselves in the Government scheme of IllamThediKalvi and for environmental and value education all the first year UG students have a compulsory paper in their curriculum to clear under the credit-based course offered by Madurai Kamaraj University. Apart from this our college offers Certificate in Gandhian Thought and Diploma in Gandhian Thought for the first and second year students to inculcate the values and thoughts of Gandhi in their minds. To maintain the rigor of learning, Fly over transition course, Vedic Maths and Musical Physics are some of the courses offered by our college for the first year UG students and for offering multidisciplinary flexible curriculum Non- Major Elective papers were opted for the students which enables the multiple entry and exist in all majors. Our college students have an opportunity to select diploma courses offered by Madurai Kamaraj University like DDTP, DYMHH and DCFE as an Interdisciplinary course during their under graduation. Our institution organised International Multi-Disciplinary Hybrid conference in the topic of "Challenges in Environmental issues and Trends in Sustainable Development Disciplinary Perspective" with the view to expand the knowledge of the students in which faculties and students contributed their creative and innovative views. Department of Physics students have developed "Herbal Sanitizer" to overcome the problem of using chemical sanitizer since it's usage becomes a major requirement from the pandemic situation of covid-19 and Energy audit is done by them for the purpose of energy conservation as an effort to engage them in multidisciplinary research endeavour to find solutions to society's most pressing issues. As a good practice, our college has introduced LMS courses for all stream students and we are having Institution's Innovation Council which promotes the activities of developing innovative & creative thinking.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Since, we are one of an affiliated institution of Madurai Kamaraj University, the process Digi Locker Account creation by the university is still in progress. After getting Digi Locker Authentication Service, we will proceed the same.

17.Skill development:

Entrepreneur Skill Development activities like Silk Thread Ornament making, Beautician Course, etc., are provided to our students through Entrepreneurship Development Cell in our

Institution. Faculties Entrepreneur skill is also being upgraded by attending the faculty development Program like "ENTRPRENEURSHIP AND INNOVATION" organized by Entrepreneurship Development and Innovation Institute (EDII) Hub, Madurai Kamaraj University and Government of Tamilnadu, Chennai. Our College Life Skill Forum offer courses like Photography, Typewriting, Karate, Silambam (Martial Arts) for UG students with an aim to provide hands on training, competencies, value based skills, etc., In order to strengthen the vocational education and soft skill of students, our Institution provides Value Added Certificate courses like Tally through Placement Cell and DDTP from the Department of Computer Science which integrates cross cutting issues relevant to Professional ethics. Department of Physics has been conducting certificate course on "House Wiring" to enhance the technical skill of wiring the house hold appliances by themselves for their needs. Our college celebrates national festivals like Independence Day, Republic day to ensure the patriotic feel among the students. Through the national commemorative day celebrations like International Youth Awakening Day, Dr.A.P.J.Abdul Kalam Birthday, World Biofuel Day, World Ozone Day, etc., to inculcate the universal human values and to build the value education among the students.CGT, DGT, DYMHH courses are offered to UG to impart Gandhiji's ideas of Ahimsa, non-violence and holistic development. Our Institution is an active member in ICT Academy of Tamilnadu through which we have an opportunity to enhance the employability skills of our students by availing the Industrial Veterans for our Seminars and Conferences. Good Practice: Our Institution has a good practice of motivating the students to undergo entrepreneur skilling courses to know the Trending Technologies and cater to the socioeconomic needs through Entrepreneurship Development Cell and provide opportunities for them to "EARN WHILE THEY LEARN". The efforts made by the Institution help the students to gain the required competencies and confidence to face the real time situations in the corporate world. It also helps in bringing the cultural change in terms of Professionalism in their approach and thinking.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Integrating the National Education Policy, N.M.S. SERMATHAI VASAN COLLEGE is extending and expanding the purviews of education to meet the new parameters. The initiatives of the institution are effectual in terms of moulding interspersed generations who grow up as individuals of unified sensibility. Bilingual education offers numerous benefits to students. It enhances cognitive abilities, improves problem-solving skills, strengthens cultural awareness, and fosters the development of valuable communication skills. The institution aims to equip its faculty members with the necessary language skills, pedagogical knowledge, and resources to effectively deliver bilingual instruction in the classroom. The institution provides teachers with resources, such as bilingual textbooks, audio-visual materials, and online resources, to facilitate bilingual classroom delivery. These resources will aid faculty members in creating a dynamic and engaging learning environment that integrates both languages effectively. The programs in Tamil (Literature and Culture), History (Traditional Knowledge) Mathematics (Vedic Mathematics), Physics (Astronomy), integrate traditional Indian Knowledge Systems wherever possible. The Department of Tamil offers a Certificate Course on "Kannini Payanpaatu Tamil" and "Thol Tamil Ealuthuru" which was organized for undergraduate BA (Tamil) students with the aim of enhancing their knowledge and practical skills in two important areas of Tamil language and literature. The Thol Tamil Ealuthuru module focused on the art of writing in the Thol Tamil calligraphic style, which holds significant cultural and historical value in Tamil Nadu. Expert calligraphers introduced various Thol Tamil scripts, letterforms, and stroke techniques. Students had hands-on practice with traditional writing tools and materials under the guidance of skilled instructors. They learned to write words, phrases, and verses in Thol Tamil, gradually mastering the fluidity and beauty of this art form. By organizing such certificate courses, our institution contributes to the preservation and promotion of the Tamil language, culture, and heritage among the younger generation. The promotion of Indian arts, traditions, and languages is also facilitated through competitions organized Youth Welfare Department. Competitions such as essay writing, poetry, speech competitions, folk songs, folk dance and skits encourage students to stay connected with their rich Indian culture and heritage.Silambam is a traditional Indian martial art.It promotes physical fitness, self-defenceskills, and cultural appreciation.Silambam practice in our institution to under the guidance of a skilled instructor not only preserves the rich cultural heritage of India but also empowers our students to defend themselves and break societal barriers The college emphasizes preserving the Indian language, culture, and tradition by celebrating Indian festivals, namely Saraswathi & AyudhaPooja, Pongal. The highlight of the event is the Kummi and Uri performances, where groups of student's form circles and dance in unison to traditional folk music. We celebrate functions during

traditional days to inculcate culture in the mind of our students. The practice of wearing saree during the 2nd and 4th Friday of every month is inculcated in our college. This practice promotes the appreciation and preservation of Indian attire. By adhering to this practice, students are encouraged to embrace the cultural heritage and showcase the beauty of sarees. Wearing sarees regularly fosters a sense of pride and identity among the students, hence promoting a sense of unity and belonging in the college community. Thirukkural Pearavai Thervu is an initiative taken by BA (Tamil) Department of the institution to all undergraduate students to showcase their love for value culture and literature of Tamil. The exam revolved around writing a comprehensive review of Thirukkural, a classic containing 1,330 Kurals, written by Tamil literary work that contains 1,330 Kurals, written by the poet Thiruvalluvar. The students worked tirelessly to read and analyze each Kural, identifying the underlying themes and messages and how it is to be implemented in their everyday life of wisdom and righteousness.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The college adopts to outcome based education for all UG programmes and PG programmes as per the syllabus of Madurai Kamaraj University the teaching and learning process captures the decided outcomes and the instructions is designed according as reflected in the course plan and pedagogy. A strong emphasis on measuring what students have learned and how well they can apply their knowledge and skill in real world situations course content, teaching methods and assessment tools are design to support and measure progress towards the outcomes. Assessment is not just mean to assign grades but also a tool for feedback and improvement continuous assessment, formative assessment and Summatative assessment methods are used to measure the student progress and provide opportunity for improvement, we clearly communicat expectations and evaluation criteria to students. This help students to understand what is expected and provide transparency in the assessment process. The degree holders can opt for further higher studies and career in various specializations in accordance with their discipline our universities syllabus strives to make the students employable incorporate /government sector/self employed. It exhibits cross cultural competency and build's ethical values. It helps the students to evaluate, analyses and formulate coherent arguments and creates self confidence among students.

20.Distance education/online education:

Online Teaching and Learning makes students more responsible for their own Education. It helps students get ready by letting them to explore, assess, share and present information in a fairly organized way. As N.M.S Sermathai Vasan college is affiliated to Madurai Kamarajar University, M.K.U is proceeding with a perfect plan and implemented the student focused "Naan Mudhalvan Scheme" which was launched by the State Government last year and aimed at enhancing the skill set of student especially at college level through offering of various skill based course and equip students with industry needed skill. Naan Mudhalvan courses were incorporated in the syllabus of semester II, IV and VI for all the departments. The electronic certificate was generated automatically after the test was finished by the students. The Learning Management System was given to the second year students. The course study materials were made available through the portal. The students took the examination and completed the course. ICT Academy in Association with the industry partner's launches "Learnathon 2023" a self-learning initiative for higher education students to build their foundation IT skills online. Nearly 350 students from CS, IT, BCA & B.COM(CA) registered and undergone the courses.

2.2.1 The institution undertakes an assessment of the learning levels of its students and organizes special programs for both slow and advanced learners. An entry-level examination is conducted to evaluate students' competency and intelligence levels before the commencement of the program. Based on the results of this assessment, students are categorized into advanced learners and slow learners, and appropriate measures are taken to cater to their individual needs.

Special measures are taken to support slow learners, including the provision of lecture notes and extra reading materials posted through class what's app group to improve their basic understanding of the subject. Additionally, special coaching and individual guidance from subject teachers are provided, and a unique value system of peer group teaching, learning, and assistance is arranged as one of the special measures to support relatively slow learners. Departments also conduct remedial classes, and revision is given in the previous year's university exam question papers.

Special programs are also designed for advanced learners, including advising them to participate in group discussions and technical quizzes to develop analytical and problem-solving abilities and improve their presentation skills. Students are also given opportunities to develop their creativity by participating in intercollegiate meet, State, National, International Level Seminars and Conferences. Coaching is provided to help students prepare for competitive examinations, and bright and diligent students are motivated and provided with opportunities to exhibit their innovative and creative thinking in the nationwide competition announced by MoE-IIC.
